



- 3. Copy of high school diploma (English and native language)
- 4. Copies of transcripts of all relevant qualifications translated into English as well as in native language
- 5. Copies of English language test scores

You will be notified by email as soon as your application is received. You will be informed if you will need to provide any missing application documents. Your transcripts and other documents must be evaluated and you will be contacted once an admission decision is made. If you have been accepted into the program, we will send you an offer of admission via email.
