About Whatcom

Whatcom Community College is a public, two-year college accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities, with programs of study that are approved by the Washington State Board for Community and Technical Colleges. Whatcom offers associate degrees in university transfer, general studies, and professional technical programs, as well as certificate programs in professional technical areas. Whatcom also provides English as a Second Language (ESL) instruction to prepare students for college level coursework.



Intensive English (ESL)

Whatcom's English Language Institute (ELI) is an excellent choice for ESL learners. ELI students have the opportunity to attend classes with people from around the world, with the ELI hosting students from more than 30 different countries each year.

Intensive Courses

The Intensive Courses allow students to study English full-time in order to prepare for college courses. These courses offer flexibility to match students' levels in discrete language skills (reading, writing, grammar and oral communication).

College Transition Courses

The College Transition Courses allow students to continue to develop their English competency and, at the same time, begin their college degree or certificate program.

International High School Completion Program

The International High School Completion (IHSC) Program allows international students who are motivated and mature to enroll at Whatcom Community College and earn both a Washington State high school diploma and associate's (university transfer) degree at the same time. Students can complete both the diploma and the degree in approximately two years (depending on English proficiency) and save time and money by completing two programs at once.

Admissions requirements:

- Students must be at least 16 years old upon start of studies
- Students must have completed at least 10th grade (or equivalent)
- Students must demonstrate high academic achievement in home country



Professional Technical Programs

Whatcom offers a variety of professional and technical degrees and certificates that provide students with the necessary knowledge and skills to work in their area of study upon completion of their program. Professional and technical programs range in length from one to two years, and can be completed alone as a single program, or in combination with other degrees and certificates.
