Flexibility: The U.S. university system offers students a wide range of choices in their undergraduate studies. Instead of focusing on a single subject, students can explore various fields of interest before finalizing their major at the end of their second year.

International Work Experience: All students who complete a U.S. degree are eligible for up to one year of Optional Practical Training (OPT) related to their course of study. Students who completed a STEM degree may apply for an additional two years of OPT.





Entry at 5.0+ IELTS





Your First Year of Study

Duration: 2 terms

Boost your English language skills

Earned Credits: 18-22 towards your SF State Degree

During your first year of study you will have a combination of general education credit courses alongside English language classes. Once you have successfully completed your first year by earning 18-22 credits and completing the English Language requirements, you can progress into the degree of your choice.

ENGLISH AND ACADEMIC SUPPORT CLASSES

During your first year of study you will have a program of mandatory classes which give both academic and English language support. These include the following topics:

- English for Academic Purposes to strengthen and develop listening,
 speaking, reading, writing, and critical thinking in the university context
- Academic acculturation on matters such as plagiarism, study skills, collaboration, critical thinking, active class participation, course requirements/ expectations and research
- Small group seminars to support academic courses
- Living in San Francisco

EXTRA SUPPORT

Our full-time Student Support Advisor will also be on campus to provide International Year One students with **ongoing assistance and guidance.** This support covers academic issues as well as practical, social and emotional needs arising from the transition to studying in the U.S.

Academic Course Overview

PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH FOR STUDENTS WHO ENTER AT IELTS UNDER 5.0

Students with IELTS under 5.0 will be placed in the Pre-Sessional English program for 1-2 terms, depending on their language proficiency.

The Pre-Sessional English program is designed to enhance student's comprehension and usage of the English language and academic skills required for university level studies. After successfully completing the assigned Pre-Sessional term(s), students will progress to the International Year One Pathway Program (IY1). Upon successful completion of IY1, students will be admitted to SF State.

FIRST TERM OF STUDY FOR STUDENTS WHO ENTER AT IELTS 5.0+

Below are details of the courses you will study in this term:

Living in San Francisco (Credits: 1)

Learn about the historical, geographic, environmental, socio-cultural, and political context of the Bay Area that draws people to this place.

Writing the First Year: Global Perspectives of Multilingual Speakers Stretch I (Credits: 4)

The first semester of the stretch version of the First-Year Writing Seminar for multi-lingual students. Focused on developing the academic reading and writing skills necessary for university coursework.

One of the following Mathematics classes depending on desired major:*

- Business Calculus (Credits: 3)
- Elementary Statistics (Credits: 3)
- Pre-Calculus (Credits: 4)
- Calculus I (Credits: 4)

University support classes with a total of 18hrs study

- Immersive Experience
- High Intermediate English for Academic Purposes
- Academic Success Skills
- Academic Support

FINAL TERM OF STUDY

Below are details of the courses you will study in your final term of your Pathway Program:

Writing the First Year: Global Perspectives of Multilingual Speakers Stretch II (Credits: 4)

Students will need to have achieved a C- or better in the first term of this class. The second semester of this class will allow extra time to revisit and practice reading and writing strategies to improve English fluency.

Critical Thinking and the Ethnic Studies Experience (Credits: 3)

Basic skills involved in understanding, criticizing, and constructing arguments by using materials reflective of experiences of ethnic/racial groups in the U.S.

One to two of the following General Education Courses*

- Fundamentals of Oral Communication (Credits: 3)
- Introduction to Microeconomic Analysis (Credits: 3)
- Survey of U.S. History for International Students (Credits: 3)

University support classes with a total of 12-14hrs study

- Immersive Experience
- Advanced English for Academic Purposes
- Academic Success Skills

English for Academic Purposes

The course teaches students the English language and critical thinking skills needed to achieve academic success according to American university expectations.

Academic Success Skills

This course will focus on the social, academic, and professional skills required to succeed in an American higher education setting and on the campus of San Francisco State University.

Academic Support

In a small group, students are encouraged to talk, think, and share more readily than in a larger group. Students also receive **ongoing individual support** from the Student Support Advisor and the Program Director throughout International Year One.

Immersive Experience

SF State offers a range of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities that ensure all international students enjoy a truly immersive experience, nurturing individual success and community connections.

REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER TO SF STATE – YEAR 2

To complete International Year One and matriculate into the second year at SF State, students must successfully complete a minimum of 18 academic units earning a "C" (2.0) Grade Point Average or higher and demonstrate English proficiency by by earning a C- (or CR or 2.0) in ENG 202.
