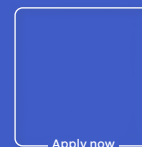

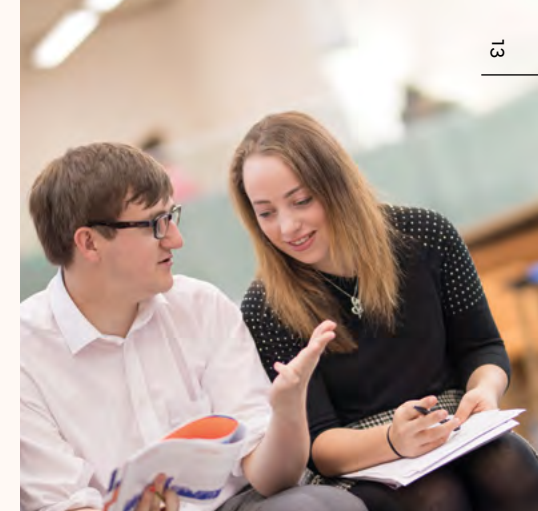

# Our location

Located on Scotland's eastern coast, Dundee is Scotland's sunniest city. Strong transport links puts spectacular scenery, skiing, championship golf, mountain climbing and sailing within easy reach of Dundee.

Dundee is home to 142,000 people, and another 300,000 people live within a 30 minute drive. Its great central location means that 90% of Scotland is within only a 90 minute drive. Scotland's four main international airports all operate both national airlines such as cities in the UK and Europe.

# Let Dundee surprise you

### V&A Dundee - Scotland's design museum

A visit to the waterfront museum will leave you in awe of all things design. There is also a cafe, restaurant, and a gift shop to pick up something extra special.

### The Law - Volcanic Sill

Some cycle, some jog, some even run, but most people just walk to the top of the hill. You will be rewarded with a beautiful view of the city, often favoured at sunrise.

### Broughty Ferry

You can catch a bus or cycle along the waterfront to reach this historic seaside town. It is as well known for its ice cream as it is for its castle.

### Dundee Contemporary Arts

A local institution with a cinema, restaurant, gallery, and print studio in one beautiful space. It hosts an annual film festival and screens blockbusters alongside the classics.

### The Dundee Rep

Home to Scotland's only full-time company of actors who produce their own shows. Regular visitors also include solo artists, comedians, operatic societies, and ballet troupes.

### Other museums

Learn about Dundee's industrial history at the Verdant Works, or enjoy some of Scotland's best artwork at the McManus. The beautifully Gothic building also traces the history of Dundee with the help of hundreds of artefacts.

### Green spaces

There are plenty of parks where you can make the most of the seasons and enjoy the colours. Magdalen Green and Balgay Park are the favourites, popular with sunbathers and joggers alike.

### University of Dundee Botanic Garden

We are probably biased, but this is one of the best green spaces in Dundee. Perfect for nature lovers and free for all of our students, it really is a little oasis in the city.

### The Waterfront

The Dundee City waterfront is undergoing a £1 billion redevelopment. There are new features popping up every few weeks for you to explore, including an Urban Beach, water fountains and a 22-tonne whale sculpture.

### Slessor Gardens

Also next to the Waterfront, the gardens host a number of events each year. It is regularly transformed into an outdoor venue for bands and artists, and was home to last year's Pride celebration.

## Discover Scotland

Dundee's spaces truly stand out. There are hills and parks, stunning views, and cobbled streets from the centre to the outskirts. Sometimes taking a break in nature is the best way to re-energise, so when you have finished exploring Dundee, the rest of Scotland and its coastline, glens, and mountains are right on your doorstep.

There are clubs and societies that like to make the most of the great Scottish countryside, such as the Surf Club's beach lessons, or the Rucksack Club's weekly hill climbing and Munro bagging (conquering one of Scotland's 282 mountains).

Many students adventure out on their own or with friends, exploring the historic sites and wilderness by car, bus, train, and even bike. Dundee's central location makes this very easy with Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Aberdeen only a short distance by car or public transport.

# Research with impact

Excellent research requires excellent ideas, and that is something we are not short of at the University of Dundee, developing ideas that make a positive impact and difference to the lives of people, the economy and the environment.

We undertake vital research with a focus on impact. We work with partners – other universities, research institutes, major charities and leading companies – around the world to deliver on our ambition. We have a long and successful track record of discovery, helping to drive innovation and solve some of the world's most pressing problems. Through our innovative Drug Discovery Unit – the only fully operational, fully integrated drug discovery group working across multiple diseases based within a UK university – we have

made discoveries such as a compound with the potential to treat malaria in a single dose. Our School of Medicine is one of the leading centres of medical education in the UK, while all the time producing research breakthroughs which improve our understanding, treatment and prevention of diseases such as cancer, diabetes and cardiovascular disease. We are now doing the same for Parkinson's disease and other neurodegenerative conditions. We are working on innovations in laser technology that are helping

upgrade the Large Hadron Collider at CERN. Our forensic scientists produce new technologies and techniques that are helping save lives and support the justice system, such as a new form of smoke alarm that is massively more efficient at waking up children than the existing model, an innovation that can save the lives of thousands. 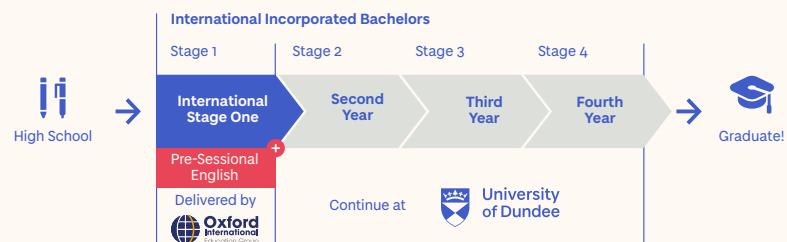

## International Incorporated Bachelors

# International Stage One (IS1)

**Intakes:** September | January | April | November

The IS1 is the first year of a four year International Incorporated Bachelors. The first year is taught at ICD and its designed to strengthen your English language abilities and introduce core concepts and knowledge required at university study level. Once you have successfully completed your studies at ICD you will continue the remaining stages of your degree directly with the University of Dundee.

## Continuing your degree at the University of Dundee

You will choose your degree before you start your IIB. Once you have successfully completed your IS1, you will continue directly onto the second year of a four year degree. In limited cases you will continue onto the first year of a three year degree.

## Core modules

As well as modules unique to your specific route, you will also study several core modules common to each course. The core modules are:

- English for Academic Purposes (EAP)
- Mathematics and Digital Literacy
- Government and Society

## Entry Requirements

To enrol on to the IS1 pathway you must meet the following entry requirements:

### English language requirements

For direct entry to the IS1 pathway the minimum overall IELTS score required is:

- **Two terms**  
IELTS 6.0 with no less than 5.5 (6.0 in Writing)
- **Three terms**  
IELTS 5.5 with no less than 5.5 in each component

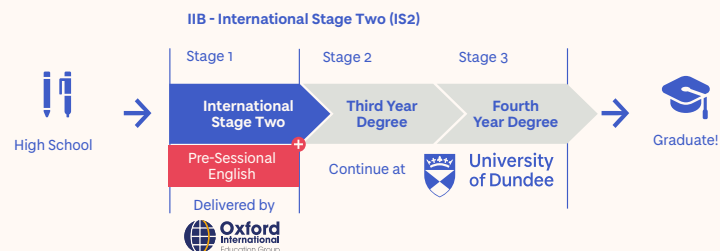

International Incorporated Bachelors (IIB)

## International Stage Two (IS2)

**Intakes:** September | January | November

The IS2 is the equivalent to second year level study of a typical four-year Scottish undergraduate degree. Taught at ICD, we provide an intensive combination of subject specific content with Mathematics and English academic literacy skills. Once you have successfully completed your pathway you will continue the remaining stages of your degree course directly with the University of Dundee.



### Routes

You can choose to study one of the following pathways:

- Business and Economics<sup>1</sup>
- Applied Finance<sup>1</sup>
- Computing

<sup>1</sup> The IS2 Business and Economics, and Applied Finance route is the equivalent to a 3-year degree.

### Continuing your degree at the University of Dundee

You will choose your degree before you start your IIB. Once you have successfully completed your IS2, you will continue onto the second year of a degree that will last 3 or 4 years in total.

### Your modules

You will study a range of modules specific to your pathway so you are prepared for your degree study at the University of Dundee. All students will take Academic Literacies as a core module across all pathways.

# International Incorporated Master's (IIM)

**Intakes:** September | November | January | April | June

A postgraduate qualification can give your career a boost and help you stand out to potential employers. It also helps if you are looking to change career and need further training to enhance your job prospects within a new field.

The International Incorporated Master's (IIM) is designed for those students who do not qualify for direct entry to a postgraduate degree at the University of Dundee. This could be because of the grades achieved in your undergraduate degree, your current qualifications are not equivalent to a UK undergraduate degree, or you need to improve your academic and English language skills.

## Key features of the IIM:

- Receive specialist support from tutors experienced in teaching international students
- Small group tuition
- Continuous formative assessment with detailed and supportive feedback
- One (3 months) or two terms (6 months) available, please refer back to each pathway for more information

## Assessment

Postgraduate study requires lots of independent work and research and throughout your studies you will be continuously assessed to make sure you are on track. In addition to project work and tests, we will give feedback in person and in writing so that you know how you are doing and how to improve.

## Continuation

The first stage of your chosen degree will be studied at ICD. Once you have completed the IIM route you will continue onto your chosen postgraduate degree with the University of Dundee.

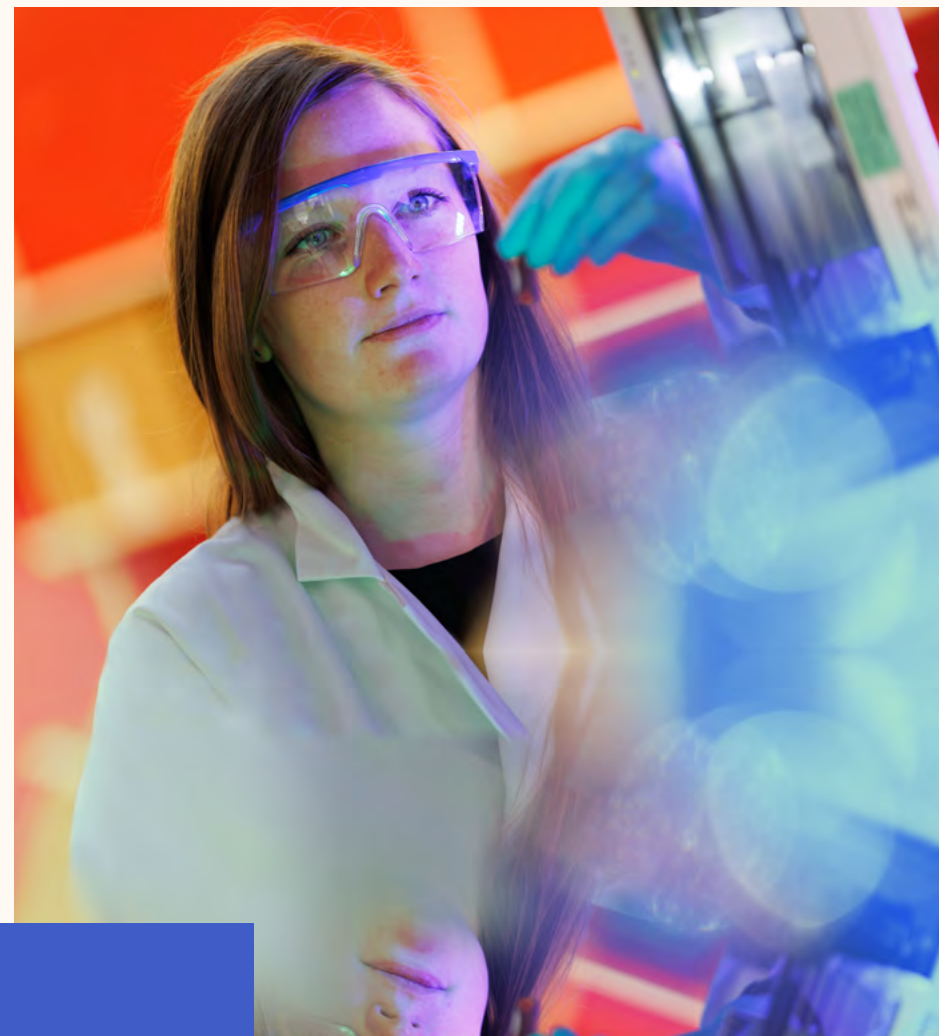

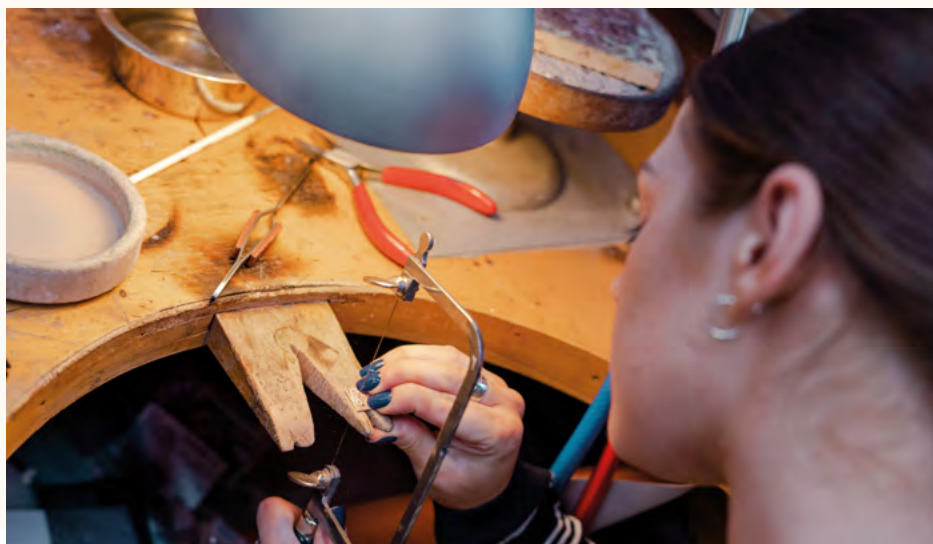
### Staying safe

A copy of a valid passport



A copy of your original qualification certificate and transcripts

Certified translation (if applicable)



A personal statement

This should outline why an applicant has chosen the university, the selected course and future career plans



Any current and previous visas, CAS and copies of exit stamps. Please also include a copy of any previous visa refusal letters



A valid copy of IELTS or Pearson PTE if the score is at 5.5 or above

One of our student advisers will support you through the application process. Below is a step-by-step guide to what will happen once you submit your application:

### Stage 1: Check qualifications

We will carefully review your application and check whether your academic qualifications and level of English language is suitable for entry to the chosen course.

### Stage 2: Issue Conditional Offer

Assuming the application is successful, we will send you a formal offer of a place.

### Stage 3: Issue Unconditional Offer

Once you have met all the conditions outlined in your Conditional Offer we will send you an Unconditional Offer.

### Stage 4: Submit deposit

To accept a place on the course, you will need to make a deposit to confirm your offer. The amount of your deposit will be confirmed in the Offer Letter.

### Stage 5: CAS issued

Upon receipt of the deposit we will request your pre-CAS documents. Once the pre-CAS documents have been received, we will issue you a Certificate of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number.

### Stage 8: Accommodation

We can arrange for a taxi transfer upon your arrival at a UK airport (additional fees apply).
