Full-time, paid work experience
for six to eight months

- Undergraduate engineering and computer science students can begin the full-time co-op program after the first semester of their junior year. The program is also available for graduate-level computer science students.
- The co-op program has 200+ corporate partners including Canon, Estée Lauder, Gerber Technology, Google, GroupM, IBM, JFK Airport, Stantec, UPS, Veeco and Zebra.

Full-time, paid work experience
for three to five months
