

2026-2027 Tuition and fees



Tuition fees for 2026-2027 are estimated from 2025-2026 prices and are subject to change.

There are two semesters per academic year (fall, spring) each about 16 weeks. Students may also take classes during a 10-week summer term for an additional cost.

On-campus housing

International Year One and Academic English students 21 and under are required to live on campus. Living on campus is highly encouraged even when not required. Pathway and AE students living on campus have access to:

- a free linen package
- early move-in prior to orientation
- guaranteed suite-style rooms
- more than a dozen on-campus dining locations
- unlimited access to on-campus fitness center
- 24-hour campus safety and security through the resident safety program
- free shuttle bus to trains, shopping and local area
- dedicated student support staff and resident assistants who can provide immediate support and attention

Meal plan: \$2,850/semester. Prices for housing include breaks during the academic year (spring break, holidays, etc.). Cost of books and supplies estimated at \$500 per semester.

Are you an F-1 student? You will need to provide proof of funding in order to get your I-20. Proof of funding is a way a student shows they have sufficient funds (usually via a recent bank statement) to live and study full-time in the US for up to one academic year. This is different from the cost of attendance OR a statement of account. The proof of funding amount will not be an amount that is billed to you and is solely for immigration purposes.
